WHAT IS MISSION CALEB ALL ABOUT

Mission Caleb Namibia started in the year 2012 with the inaugural project held at the town of Outapi in the Omusati Region. It is modeled after Mission Caleb South America, but in the local context and incorporates medical missionary ideals to enhance a holistic approach to Evangelism.

It is composed mainly of youth and adults who are baptized and zealous in the spreading of the gospel to all the world but primarily in the Republic of Namibia.

Mission Caleb Project is an adopted Youth Evangelist Project under the Namibia North and South Conference Youth Department, which is scheduled to run every December for 2 weeks and a half.

The project aims at penetrating areas of Namibia that have not yet been reached by the Seventh-day Adventist message. The mission is an opportunity for young Adventists to share the only perfect and lasting solution to the problems of a community that is embedded in a needy and dying world: the message of the second advent of Jesus Christ.



2025 MISSION AREA

Mission Caleb 2025 was held in Mpungua territory under the Namibia North Conference, from **December 5 to 20 , 2025**.

Mpungu is a settlement and a former [mission station](#) of the [Finnish Missionary Society](#) in the [Mpungu Constituency](#) in the [Kavango West Region](#) in Northern [Namibia](#). It is located ca. 40 km south-west of [Nkurenkuru](#) and is inland as opposed to other former Finnish mission stations, which were located along the [Kavango River](#). Today, a tarred highway from Ovamboland to Kavango connects Mpungu to other places in northern Namibia.



ATTENDANCE

A total of **110 missionaries** from various churches under the **Namibia North and South Conferences** participated in **Mission Caleb 2025**.

- **South Conference:** Windhoek Central, Opanganda, Katutura, Otjomusiose, Otjiwarongo, Grootfontein and Kuisebmond.



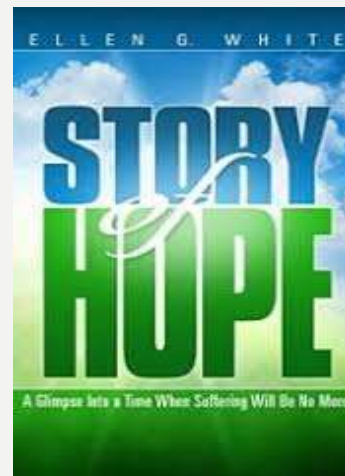
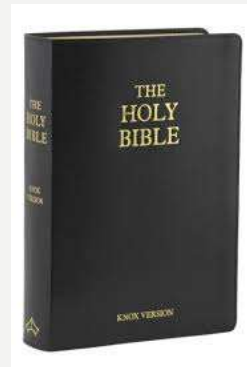
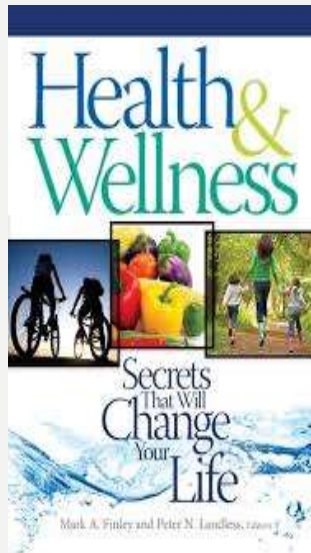
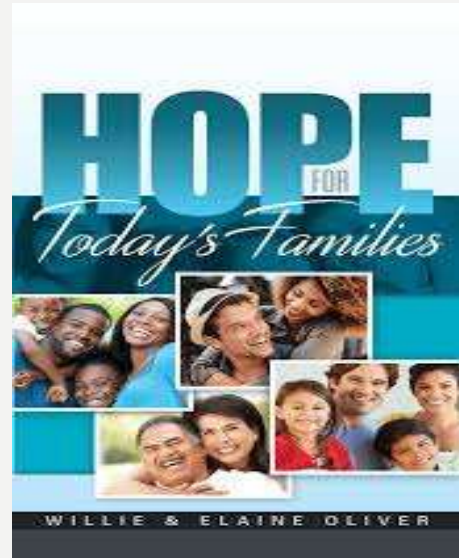
OUTREACH REPORT

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The Mission Caleb outreach program aimed to spread the gospel and share hope through distributing spiritual and health literature to the community. This report highlights the distribution of books, pamphlets, and the number of people who enrolled and graduated from the Voice of Prophecy (VOP) Bible studies during this outreach initiative.



A total of 927 books were distributed in various languages:

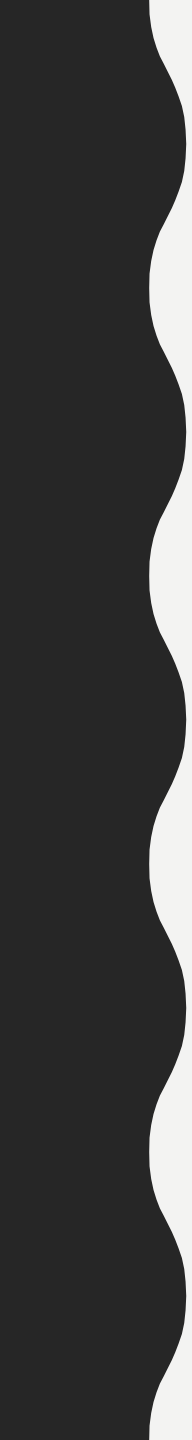


HEATH DEPARTMENT REPORT

HEATH DEPARTMENT REPORT

This report provides a summary of the activities carried out by the Health Department during the Mission Caleb 2025 . The focus is on the health expos held on 18 December 2025, which offered basic health services and assessments to the community. The report also highlights client statistics, referrals, and recommendations for future missions.





HEALTH EXPO



PURPOSE OF EVENT

To promote healthy lifestyle habits through NEWSTART model and offer basic health education and screening to the community as well as spiritual outreach.

HEALTH EXPO

The Health Expo featured interactive stations based on the NEWSTART principles. Attendees received health education, free screenings, and practical demonstrations promoting a balanced lifestyle. Spiritual outreach was also included with distribution of a number of bibles, The Great Controversy and Health and wellness offering holistic care for both body and soul. Health checks; Blood pressure, blood sugar and BMI were done.





OBSERVATIONS & OUTCOMES

Total attendance was 105 people, aged 16 to 80 years. No referrals were made most clients were stable and coping.

Many attendees expressed appreciation for the event, especially the free health checks and practical tips at each station, including spiritual outreach. Spiritual aspect prayer booths and book distribution were well received.

Overall, the feedback was positive, with attendees requesting more frequent events of this kind.







COMMUNITY SERVICE DEPARTMENT

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The Mission Caleb Community Service Department continues to fulfil its mission of meeting the physical needs of the community by providing clothing, footwear, food parcels, and housing support to the less fortunate. This report summarizes the community service activities and achievements during this outreach period.



CLOTHING & SHOE DISTRIBUTION

Over **4,657 pieces of clothing** were distributed to individuals and families in need. The clothing provided much-needed relief, especially for vulnerable groups such as children, the elderly, and unemployed individuals.

A total of **128 pairs of shoes** were given to those in need, helping many community members improve their living conditions by providing suitable footwear for daily activities.



FOOD PARCEL DISTRIBUTION

Food parcels were distributed to **65 households**, providing essential nourishment and helping to reduce food insecurity in the community. Each parcel contained a variety of staple foods to support families for an extended period.

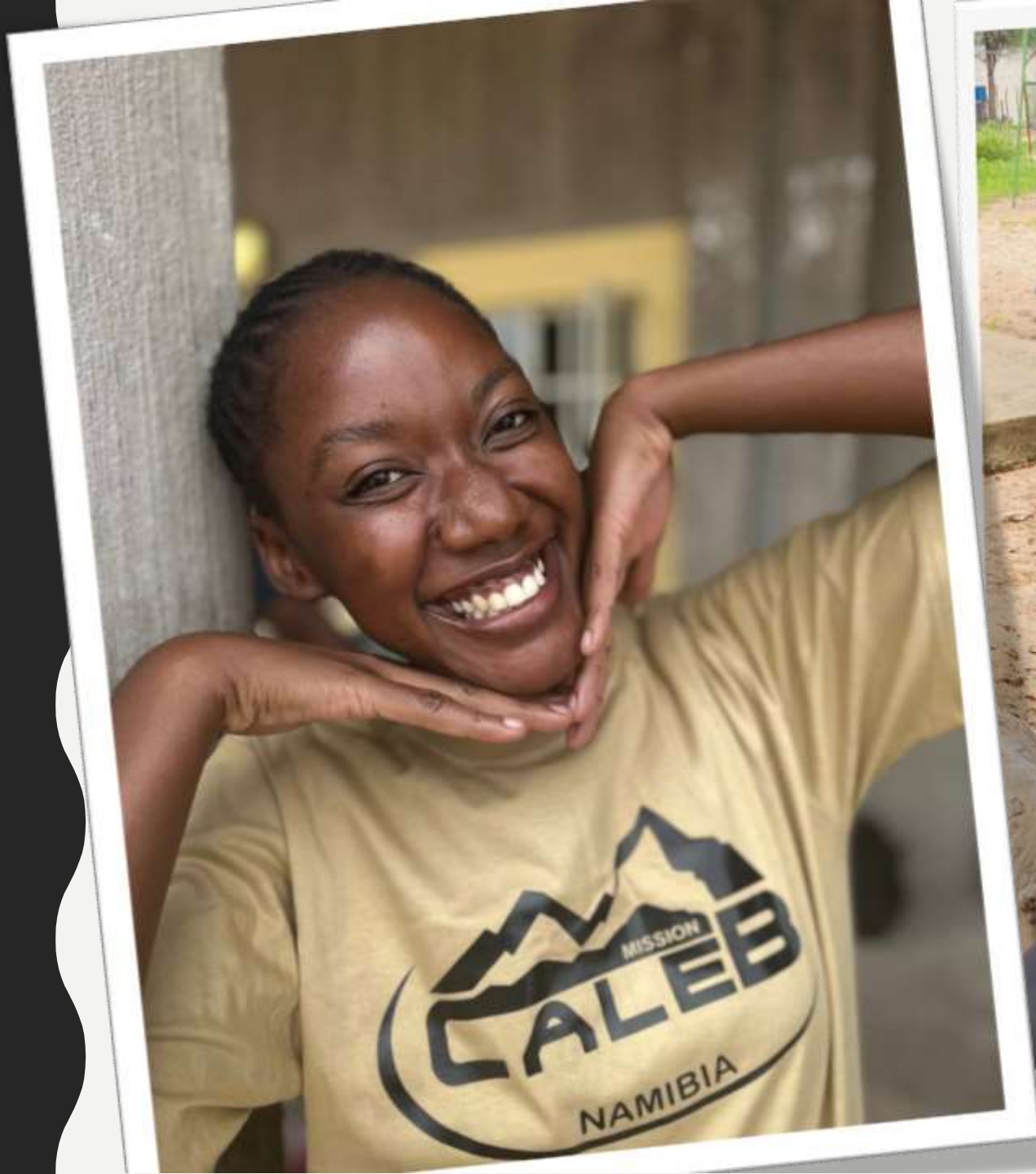






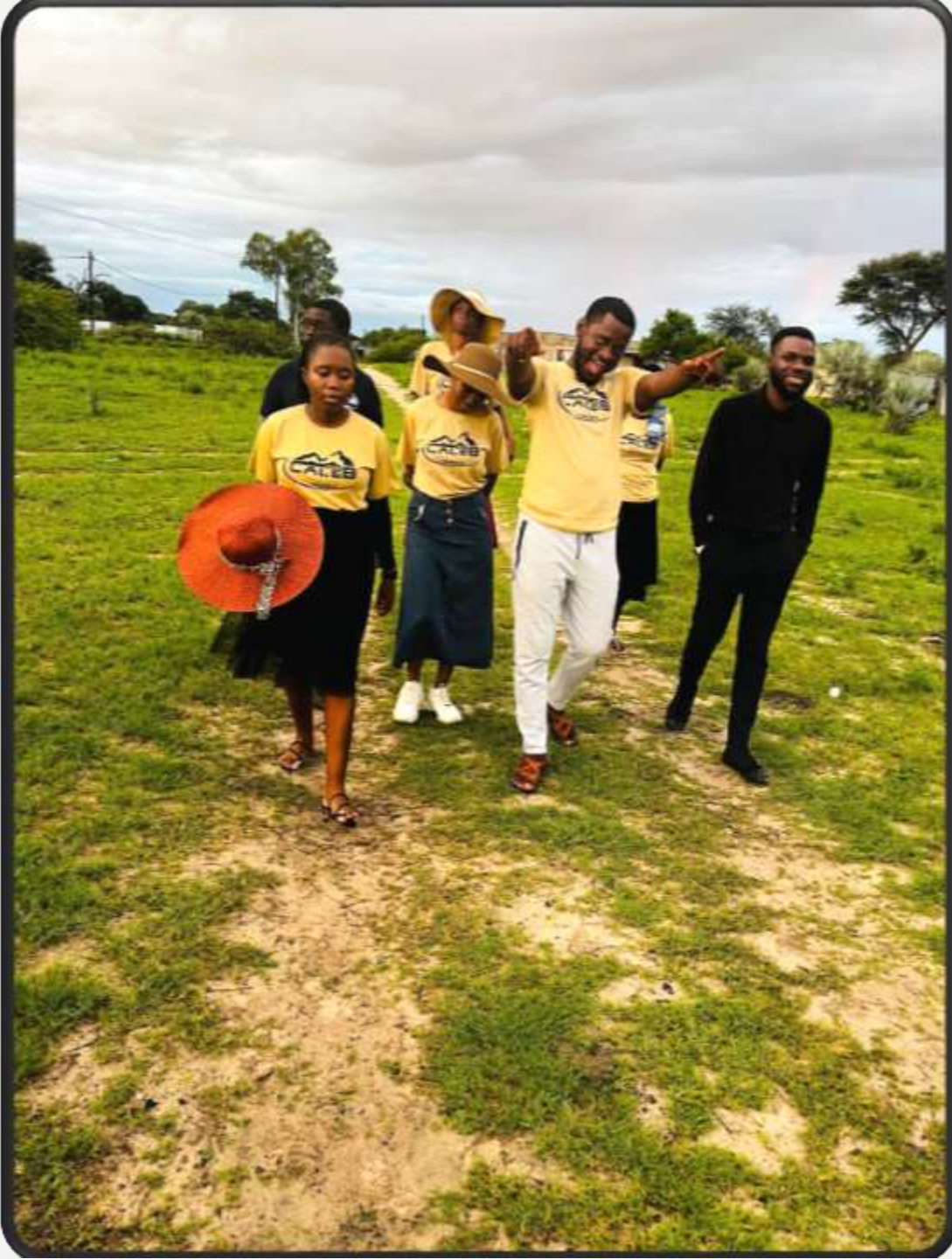
